Man of the Match: Luke Williams

First win since 2000 over KEQMS

(KEQMS 106 all out, Rossall 107-7 – Won by 3 wickets)

After the disappointment against Stonyhurst the 1st XI bounced back to make it 3 wins in 4 matches with a pleasing victory against KEQMS.

The 1st XI won the toss and put KEQMS knowing their best chance of winning the game was to bowl KEQMS out. A match winning opening spell from Luke Williams 2-15 who removed 2 out of KEQMS top three helped create pressure from the off. Toby Lester again showed his class but as normal did not pick up the wickets he so richly deserved. The off spin of Sid Bhuyan proved too much for the KEQMS middle order as he ended with figures of 5-40. KEQMS finished on 106 which in truth should not have been too much of a problem as the home track was good for batting.

However as has often been the way in the past, the 1st XI stumbled across the finishing line as KEQMS fought back admirably. Chris Metcalfe was unlucky to be given out for 23 and with Sid Bhuyan also shining with the bat scoring a quick fire 23* helped the 1st XI reach the target in 28 Overs.

2nd XI Vs KEQMS (KEQMS 78, Rossall 79-2 – won by 8 wickets)

A tremendous bowling display from James Gregory 3-8 helped make it three wins in a row for the much improved 2nd XI. Timo Zielinsky finished with figure of 2-15 and Jack Bradley 2-6 as KEQMS were bowled out for just 78. In reply James Wilson scored 30 but it was Tobias Holder-Williams who led by example smashing the ball to all parts scoring 24 off just 8 balls - In the end an easy 8 wicket victory secured in just 11 overs!

U15 Vs KEQMS (KEQMS 168 all out, Rossall 169-6 – won by 4 wickets)

A fine bowling display by the U15's helped restrict KEQMS to 168 on a fine batting track in Lytham. Perry Andrews took 3-11, Harry Talbot 2-19 and William Parker 2-30 as Rossall's impressive bowling attack were on top for most of the innings. Despite the early set back losing William Parker 2nd ball Jack Morrison (49) and Perry Andrews (40) set the platform for Louis Weir (25) and Frazer Forster (26) to see the 15's home by 4 wickets.

U14 Vs KEQMS (KEQMS 68 all out, Rossall 69-0 – Won by 10 wickets)

This was a fantastic result for an U14 side who were hammered by the same opposition last year. Josh Williams took 4-27 and Harry Mawer 3-8 as KEQMS were dismissed for just 68. In reply the openers of Josh Williams (34*) and captain Stephen Kane (27*) reached the total in just 10 overs as the U14's won by an impressive 10 wickets.

U13 Vs KEQMS (Rossall 120 all out, KEQMS 96 all out – won by 24 runs)

The U13's won an epic encounter against KEQMS. Tom Ardrone top scored with 58 in just 9 Overs as Rossall posted an average total of 120 – which was very gettable on the KEQMS ground. In reply Tom Morrison bowled beautifully as he took 3-22 as did James Smith who wrapped up the innings with figures of 3-24. In the end the U13's held their nerve as they won their 3rd game of the season.

U12 Vs KEQMS (*Rossall 93-8, KEQMS – Lost by 4 wickets*)

Rossall batted first and posted a solid total of 93-8 in 25 overs. The star of the show was the in form Joseph Eastham who scored 30 and William Hawley-Evans who played well for innings of 26. In reply KEQMS reached the total with just 8 balls remaining despite the best efforts of Jonny Lee who took 3-13.
