

What's more, pupils who choose the BTEC National Diploma in Design will be exempt from having to study a Foundation Year, prior to Art College or University, which is a great saving in both time and money. Over the summer holidays we have invested heavily into the Design Technology department to bring our facilities up to the required standard for the course and the improved department will be available to view on Open Day.
